WESTTOWN SCHOOL WESTTOWN, PA.

George L. Jones

We are glad to announce that permission has been given by the State Board of Health for the re-opening of school. We were entirely clear of the epidemic over two weeks ago, but the disease was then spreading so rapidly throughout the country that the State authorities deemed it unwise to gather so large a group together from various sections, with the necessary traveling on trains and trolleys.


We plan now to open school on Third-day the 29th. We trust that all may be able to return promptly by that afternoon, with the expectation of getting into full swing of school work the next morning.


There is prudence in returning by automobile rather than by train where it is possible to do so. The Board of Health forbids visiting within the school, except on urgent business, until such time as normal conditions prevail entside.


Memo from principal of Westtown School (Westtown PA) to parent in Pleasantville NY, announcing school reopening (24 October 1918)






Induction notice (left) and portrait (right) of Alton Miller of Kingston NY

Letters to mother (29 September 1918, left) and father (5 October 1918, right)







Portrait (left) and letter to sister, Adah (5 September [i.e., October] 1918, right)
