- Manhattan Maternity & Dispensary (merged with New York Hospital in 1932 and became the NYH Department of Pediatrics)
- Lying-in Hospital of the City of New York (merged with New York Hospital in 1932, and became the Department of Ob/Gyn)

No. — Ludlow Street — Third Child. Family very poor, living in two dark rear rooms. Man deserted three months ago; said as he could not secure work his family would be better off without him. Woman trying to make a living by taking lodgers, who pay her one dollar each, per month, for privilege of sleeping on floor. Gave her all necessary assistance and sent in cleaner daily. Woman up on second day, but suffered relapse, and was quite ill for another ten days. Very grateful for all kindness.


