Given at the Annual Meeting of AAHM, April 30, 2015

Founded in 2009, it is a "digital curation collaborative among some of the world's leading medical libraries, promotes free and open access to quality historical resources in medicine." Digitized materials reside in Internet Archive (IA)

Members include College of Physicians of Philadelphia, Columbia, Harvard, National Library of Medicine, National Museum of Health & Medicine, and Yale, among others. We have tagged materials from University of Toronto, UCSF, Brandeis, Tufts, Weill Cornell Medical College, and others.

European partners include Wellcome, London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine, Royal College of Physicians (London & Edinburgh) and others (ongoing project).

2010 Sloan Foundation grant to digitize books.

2013 NEH grant to digitize pre-1923 US medical journals.

2013 CLIR Hidden Collections grant to Harvard & JHUMI Archives to process collections relating to the history of US public health.

2015 NEH grant to digitize state medical society journals past the 1923 copyright cutoff date.
