Other notable artists include Cecilia Beaux, William Franklin Draper, Thomas Hicks, Eastman Johnson, Jean MacLane, and Samuel Lovett Waldo. 

Choice Receipts, a manuscript recipe book dating to 1680, contains recipes that may have been used in a banqueting context. Included here are recipes for fruit preserves, hearty pudding and meat dishes, and desserts.

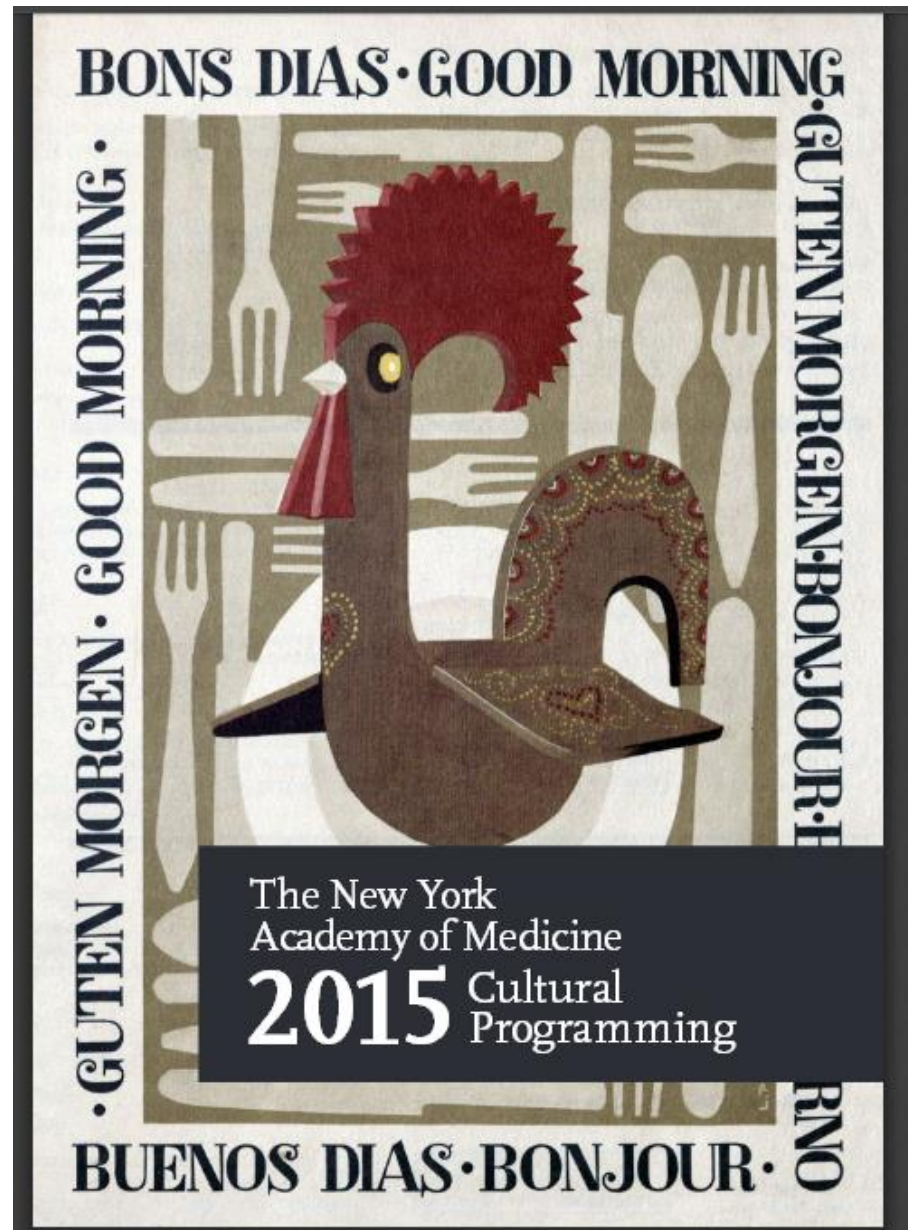

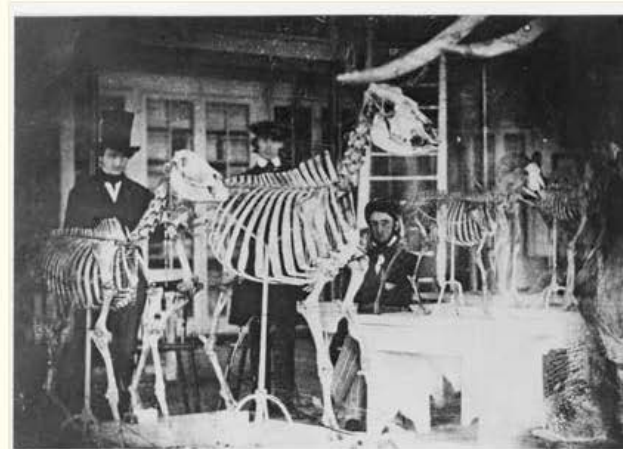
